Broussard Middle School 2023-2024 SCHOOL-PARENT & FAMILY COMPACT and SCHOOLWIDE GOALS

Broussard Middle School and the parents/caregivers of the student agree this compact outlines how the families, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and families will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve Louisiana's high standards.

Broussard Middle School Vision Statement: Within five years, Broussard Middle School will be ranked academically within the top 10% of middle schools in the state of Louisiana.

Broussard Middle School Mission Statement: The mission of Broussard Middle School is to promote a love of learning through excellence in academics, creativity in the arts, and the development of life skills.

The following are our schoolwide goals at a glance. Note: These indices were calculated by LPSS Accountability Department and may be slightly different than the indices to be released by the Louisiana Department of Education later this Fall. However, it is important for us to use the data we have to begin working towards improvement.

English Language Arts Goal:

By the end of the 2023-24 school year, the ELA department will increase each grade level cohort's index score by <u>2.5</u> index points, as evidenced by the change between their 22-23 LEAP 2025 index and their 23-24 LEAP 2025 index.

Math Goal:

By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, the BMS school wide math index will increase by 4 points, from a 69.1 to a 73.1, as evidenced by the LEAP 2025 statewide assessment.

Science Goal:

By the end of the 2023-24 school year, the science index will increase by 3 points, from <u>58.4</u> to <u>61.4</u>, as measured by the LEAP 2025 statewide assessment.

Social Studies Goal:

By the end of the 23-24 school year, <u>65%</u> of all Social Studies students, in grades 6-8, will show mastery of the four social studies strands related to the social studies Leap2025 assessment.

Discipline Goal:

The percentage of students receiving in and out of school suspensions will be <u>within 5%</u> of each subgroups' enrollment percentage.

Attendance Goal:

The percentage of students who are absent 11 or more days will decrease by 4%, moving from 14% to 10%.

School Responsibilities

Broussard Middle School will:

- 1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables students to meet Louisiana Student Standards as follows:
 - Align instruction with Louisiana Student Standards
 - Ensure that teachers/staff have acceptable subject matter knowledge and effective instructional strategies
 - Make certain teachers/staff have the materials necessary for instruction
 - Use assessments to make instructional decisions
 - Respect and address the individual needs of students; provide all services designated in each student's Individualized Education Plan (IEPs for special education students only) or Individualized Accommodation Plan (for students having a disability under Section 504) and/or English Learners Accommodation Checklist.
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:
 - October 18 2023 from 11:00 AM-7:00 PM
 - February 8, 2024 (after school day ends)-February 9, 2024 (7:30 AM-11:30 AM)
- 3. **Provide families with frequent reports on their children's progress.** Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:
 - Report cards will be sent home every nine weeks
 - Progress reports will be sent home midway between report cards
 - Provide copies of annual testing results
- 4. **Provide parents with reasonable access to staff.** Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with families as follows:
 - Parent-teacher conferences are October 18, 2023 and February 8-9, 2024
 - Teachers/staff will respond to parents' request for contact within 24 hours, whenever feasible
- 5. Provide families opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe/learn about classroom activities, as follows:
 - Parent/volunteer participation sign-up sheets will be disseminated through Google forms, at Open House, and at Parent Teacher Conferences
 - Families will be able to to observe / learn about classroom activities through take home folders and parent / family engagement activities, including, but not limited to, our Family Reading Safari and Math, Science, & Tech night

Parent/Adult Family Members' Responsibilities

- Monitoring attendance and ensuring timeliness and regular attendance
- Monitoring assignments and grades
