



# ECA Program of Studies

The ECA Program of Studies will be followed by all students enrolling as ECA freshmen beginning in the fall of 2017.

### Criteria for admissions by incoming 9th grade students, beginning in fall 2017:

- Scores of at least Mastery on the 7<sup>th</sup> grade LEAP/PARCC tests in at least one area, ELA and math, and at least Basic in the other area **OR** scores at or above the 70<sup>th</sup> percentile on a nationally normed standardized test in ELA and math (for private school, home school, and out of state students), **AND**
- No grades lower than a B in all 8<sup>th</sup> grade core courses (English, math, science, social studies), **AND**
- Favorable recommendations from the student's 8<sup>th</sup> grade ELA and math teachers to be placed in honors classes

### Criteria for entry into the lottery by incoming 10th grade students, beginning in fall 2017:

- Scores of Good or Excellent on the Algebra EOC exam, **AND**
- No grades lower than a B in all 9<sup>th</sup> grade regular core courses (English, math, science, social studies) or a C in all honors core courses, **AND**
- Scores of at least Mastery on the 8<sup>th</sup> grade LEAP/PARCC tests in at least one area, ELA and math, and at least Basic in the other area **OR** scores at or above the 70<sup>th</sup> percentile on a nationally normed standardized test in ELA and math (for private school, home school, and out of state students), **AND**
- Favorable recommendations from the student's 9<sup>th</sup> grade ELA and math teachers to be placed in honors classes

Students chosen by the lottery to be candidates for admission to ECA will be required to take the ACT Engage test and to participate in an interview at ECA. During 10<sup>th</sup> grade students will be required to take a test in Reading, ELA and Math that SLCC uses for placement into college classes. Based on their placement test scores, students may be required to take developmental/remedial classes to prepare them for the rigor of SLCC courses in English and math.
