Pre-Kindergarten Goal: Currently, our school's Early Childhood, pre-kindergarten, performance rating/score is a 6.08 Excellent. Our goal is to maintain an Excellent rating.

English Language Arts Goal: By Spring 2024, ELA Index will increase from 48.5 to 53.4

Math Goal: By Spring 2024, Math Index will increase from 37.4 to 42.3

Science Goal: By Spring 2024, Science Index will increase from 38.4 to 43.3

Discipline Goal: By the end of 2023-2024, the out-of-school suspension rate will decrease from 15% to 12.5%.

Attendance Goal: 28%, a total of 124 students, in 22-23 were truant. By the end of the 23-24 school year, the number of students having 10 or more unexcused absences will decrease from 28% to 22%.

School Responsibilities

- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:
 - October 18 2023 from 11:00 AM-7:00 PM
 - February 8, 2024 (after school day ends)-February 9, 2024 (7:30 AM-11:30 AM)
- 3. **Provide families with frequent reports on their children's progress.** Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:
 - Report cards will be sent home every nine weeks
 - Progress reports will be sent home midway between report cards
 - Provide copies of annual testing results
- 4. **Provide parents with reasonable access to staff.** Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with families as follows:
 - Parent-teacher conferences are October 18, 2023 and February 8-9, 2024
 - Teachers/staff will respond to parents' request for contact within 24 hours, whenever feasible

 - Parent/volunteer participation sign-up sheets will be disseminated throughout the school year.
