Lafayette High School Dual Enrollment Opportunities and Requirements

Dual Enrollment is a program that allows students to earn both high school and college credit at no tuition cost to the student. LPSS will cover a total of **12 credits hours (usually 4 college courses)** for a student's entire high school career. After that, students can still participate in dual enrollment but must cover the course cost. At this time, LPSS will cover materials for dual enrollment classes. LHS works with UL Lafayette and LSU to offer opportunities on campus at LHS as well as on campus at UL Lafayette.

Special Dual Enrollment on UL Lafayette's Campus 11th-12th

UL offers academic credits through several different classes. The district covers the cost of these special courses even if it exceeds the 12 hours allotted and students earn credits that can be used towards graduation. Students can take up to three Dual Enrollment classes per semester. At this point, LPSS will cover materials. Students are responsible for transportation to <u>UL Lafayette's campus</u>. Dual Enrollment on Campus at LHS (UL Lafayette, LSU: 11th-12th)

Extenuating Circumstances to be aware of:

Dropping the class/Poor grades/Do not maintain eligibility

- Understand that the grades they earn in these Dual Enrollment classes also count toward their college GPA and can affect TOPs continued eligibility and graduate school admissions.
- If a student drops the class WITHIN the first five days of the institution's start date, there is no penalty to their high school or college transcript. There is no restriction on future dual enrollment participation.
- If a student drops the class AFTER the first five days of the institution's start date and before their assigned "Drop" date, a W will appear on their college transcript; nothing will appear on their high school transcript. They will have to appeal to take another class through Dual Enrollment in the future. The high school schedule will be changed accordingly.
- Students (i.e. stops attending) cannot "Drop" after the official drop date, they will earn an "F" on both their college and high school transcript. This "F" will also be calculated in their 1st semester TOPs GPA and could threaten TOPs and financial aid eligibility. They can no longer participate in Dual Enrollment. High school schedule will be changed accordingly.
- If the class is at the college, students are responsible for dropping the course with the institution. Please be mindful of drop dates.
- If the class is at LHS, the teacher will inform the Dual Enrollment coordinator and the student's schedule will be changed accordingly (i.e. student fails English III/Engl101 - will be moved to a full credit English III course to hopefully pass and will not be able to participate in future dual enrollment).
- Some degree programs at UL Lafayette/LSU require that students earn a "C" or better in certain classes in order for those classes to count towards a student's college degree and can make students retake classes until earned; however, for graduation purposes, students will earn high school credit with a "D" but would not be allowed to continue in any future dual enrollment. Talk to UL Lafayette/LSU for clarification for degree specifics.
- High School dual enrollment grades are weighted on a 5 point grading scale (ie a B is worth 4 points); however, on a student's college transcripts, grades are not weighted (ie is B is worth 3 points). In addition, grades in dual enrollment courses are on a 10 point grading scale, example 90 is an A for both high school and college transcripts.
- Dual Enrollment courses must follow the college's attendance policy. Please review
- class specific syllabus for exact information.
- If you are taking a fall and spring course, per PPP you must stay in the spring course as long as you are in good standing.
