

- Support for mining (oil & gas) -22,037 - Projected growth 10%



































Manufacturing Industry

A Tale of Two Students

The annual demand for occupations that required a Bachelor's Degree or more was **780**. UL Lafayette had **2,741** graduates.







Average annual salary for jobs that require a Bachelor's Degree or more: \$58,332

In the 2011-12 School Year...

In the same time frame, there were **579** graduates from SLCC; yet an occupational demand of **2,500** for positions that require vocational training beyond high school up to a two-year degree.

Average annual salary for jobs that require vocational training or a 2 year college degree: \$41,053










