

HOMEBOUND INSTRUCTION

When it is anticipated that a student will be absent from school because of accident, illness, or injury for a period of more than three weeks, the student shall be eligible to receive homebound instruction.

1. A child receiving homebound instruction must be enrolled in a public school and counted as present.
2. There must be a written statement from the child's doctor before a child is accepted for homebound instruction. This statement will set the limits for the homebound teaching.
3. The Homebound Lead Teacher will assign the homebound teacher.
4. The homebound teacher will contact the school and will attempt to keep the child up with his class.
5. The parents will be given instructions concerning the requirements for the homebound teacher.
6. Conferences with the principal and/or the child's teacher will be a regular part of the homebound program.
7. Conferences with doctors, or health agencies will be held when needed.
8. Grades for the educational progress of the child will be sent to the school by the homebound teacher at the end of the homebound services.
