

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Graduation requirements shall be those set forth by the State Board of Education in Bulletin 741, which details the various ways a regular high school diploma and an equivalency high school diploma may be earned.

Methods for earning a regular high school diploma include:

1. Earning the appropriate units of eligible credit. (See requirements for high school graduation file: IHF-E.)
2. Completing the above requirements under the early college admissions plan. (See File: IDCE.)
3. Being a veteran or member of the armed forces and earning eight (8) or more resident high school credits and successfully completing the GED test.
4. A member of the United States Armed Forces, or an honorably discharged veteran, shall be awarded a regular high school diploma upon completion of 20 or 22 or 23 units of work, depending upon the graduation requirements in effect upon his/her entry in high school, regardless of the requirements for regular graduates.

Methods for earning an equivalency high school diploma include:

1. Enrolling in the Adult Education Program and successfully completing the GED test.
2. Being a veteran or member of the armed forces and successfully completing the GED test.
