

STUDENT EXPULSION

Expulsions from school may occur as a result of frequent suspensions (LA. R.S. 416 states that four suspensions shall result in expulsion) or because of very serious infractions which violate state and parish regulations governing student behavior.

Upon the recommendation by a principal for the expulsion of any student as authorized by law, a due process hearing will be conducted by the Superintendent or his designee. Upon the conclusion of the hearing, the Superintendent or his designee shall determine whether said student shall be expelled from the school system or if other corrective or disciplinary action shall be taken. Until the hearing takes place, the student shall remain suspended from the school.

The parent, tutor or legal guardian may appeal the expulsion in compliance with the guidelines stated in Policy File: JCAA.
